courteous	being polite or showing good manners
discrimination	treating someone unfairly
human rights	an entitlement to have or do something
inclusion	including everyone, whoever they are
prejudice	not liking or trusting someone or a group of people because of who they are or what they believe in
privacy	the right to be let alone, or freedom from interference or intrusion
polite	showing good manners or respect for other people
respect	recognising, valuing and appreciating the rights, beliefs, practices and differences of other people and showing that you care about the feelings and well-being of others
responsibility	a moral obligation to behave correctly towards or in respect of
safety	free from danger or harm
stereotype	when people or groups of people are described as if they all look or behave in a certain way e.g. 'all boys love football'; 'all girls have long hair'.
