The 3 'R's

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle - these three 'R' words are an important part of sustainable living, as they help to cut down on the amount of waste we have to throw away.

It's Really simple!

· Reduce the amount of waste you produce.

- · Reuse items as much as you can before replacing them.
- · Recycle items wherever possible.

Using the 3 % s also helps to minimise the amount of space needed for landfill sites, where watte materials are

Fairtrade	Providing better prices, decent working conditions and sustainability.
Charity	An organisation set up to provide help and raise money for those in need.
Recycle	To use the materials from an item again
Positive	A desirable quality or attribute.
Negative	An undesirable quality or attribute.
