What do animals eat?

Herbivores - animals who eat plants.

Carnivores - animals who eat meat.

Omnivores - animals who eat both plants and meat.



What key features do animals have?

Mammals have hair or fur, they are warm-blooded, they give birth to their young.

Amphibians are cold-blooded, live on land, lay eggs and have webbed feet.

Fish are cold-blooded, live in water, they lay eggs in water.

Reptiles are cold-blooded, they live on the land, they lay eggs and have bumpy skin or scales.

Birds have feathers, wings, and a beak. Birds lay eggs to have babies. Birds are warm-blooded.
